The Division of Lifelong Learning at the University of Maine offers a wide range of degree programs, certificates, and courses for working people including the bachelor's degree in University Studies, an adult degree completion program, and the master's degree in Interdisciplinary Studies with concentrations in Maine Studies and Peace and Reconciliation Studies as well as certificates and minors in Labor Studies, Maine Studies, and Peace and Reconciliation Studies. Many of these courses can be taken entirely on-line or with a limited number of meetings on campus.

The programs offered by the Division of Lifelong Learning provide students with a guide to Maine's rich history, geography and diverse cultures, linking students to the state's cultural, political and economic heritage and giving students an opportunity to develop skills in labor relations and conflict resolution that will benefit them in the workplace.
