I. Call to Order, Introductions, Attendance and Pledge of Allegiance

President Peter Baldacci called the meeting to order at 10:12 a.m. The attendees recited the Pledge of Allegiance and all present introduced themselves.

II. Approval of/Additions to the Agenda

<u>Comm. Fowler moved and Comm. Cote seconded approving the agenda with no additions. The</u> <u>motion was approved unanimously.</u>

III. Approval of February 22, 2016 Board of Directors' Meeting Minutes

<u>Comm. Blodgett moved and Comm. Fowler seconded approving the minutes from the Board of</u> <u>Directors' meeting on February 22, 2017. The motion was passed.</u>

IV. Old Business

A. Update on Executive Director Replacement

President Baldacci reported the Executive Committee has developed a job opening announcement. There has already been interest in the opening from Randy Greenwood, Lori Fowle, and Charlie Pray. The group discussed possible arrangements. <u>Comm. Fournier moved to</u> <u>give the Executive Committee authority to negotiate a short-term contract through June with a</u> <u>legislative specialist as a contractor or consultant not an employee. Furthermore, the Executive</u> <u>Committee will move forward with the candidate search. Comm. Fowler seconded the motion</u> <u>and it passed with no opposing votes.</u>

V. New Business

A. County Government Day Proclamation

County Government Day will be celebrated on Monday April 3rd in the Hall of Flags at the Maine State House. Somerset County has generously sponsored the refreshments for the event. Comm. Blodgett spoke on the history of County Day. President Baldacci encouraged all counties to participate. Legislators are expected to be on site that day and have been invited. <u>Comm.</u> Fournier made a motion to approve the 2017 proclamation of County Government Month and County Government day, "Brilliant Ideas at Work." Comm. Fowler seconded the motion and it passed with no opposition.

VI. Reports

A. Executive Director's Report

Executive Director Rosemary Kulow presented her verbal report outlining her activity in February. She stated Kennebec County's meeting with Governor LePage on March 21st could include up to seven county representatives. They plan to discuss the jail budget shortfall and get his support for supplemental funding. Comm. Coward, Comm. Fowler, Comm. Jabar, Admin. Bob Devlin are expected to attend. Bob said Comm. Crockett may not attend as her husband is gravely ill.

Comm. Baldacci mentioned an editorial in the Bangor Daily News about the Penobscot County expansion. They plan to acquire the nearby former YMCA building to address the issue of jail overcrowding. This will help alleviate the crowding problem, but not the funding issue. Ms. Kulow said there is a public hearing for several of the LD's the MCCA is monitoring on March 15 including LD 463 An Act To Improve the Funding of County Jails. Attendees should be prepared to answer questions.

<u>Comm. Cote made a motion to approve the report. Comm. Fowler seconded the motion and it</u> was unanimously passed.

B. Financial Report

Executive Director Rosemary Kulow presented her report. There were no questions from Board members regarding the report. <u>Comm. Blodgett moved and Comm. Fowler seconded approving</u> the report. The motion was passed with no opposing votes.

C. Legislative Report

Office Manager Lauren Haven reported that the MCCA website was being updated daily with the status of bills the MCCA is monitoring as well as a list of legislative events scheduled for those bills. Comm. Fowler asked if MCCA staff could email or text a reminder about these events. Lauren said she would put a widget on the webpage for interested parties to sign up for this service.

D. Association Reports

EMAD: Sean Goodwin reported the association has been discussing the prospect of building a county disaster relief fund.

MACCAM: Administrator Andrew Hart reported the last meeting had been cancelled and was not aware of the next scheduled meeting date.

MECCA: Comm. Fowler recommended the NENA conference in May. The educational sessions and speakers are high quality and very engaging. There was a E911 council meeting March 7th in which the group discussed the issue of providing and/or asking for too much information in the service, "I Am Responding." The technology is crucial, but the system is not overly secure. The specifics about a call could be visible to anyone with access to a phone that uses the service installed. Ms. Fowler stated a policy should be developed limiting the extent of information shared to protect the privacy of the people involved.

MSA: Ms. Haven reminded Board members about the Maine Sheriff's Association's Annual Conference on March 28 and 29. Registration information is posted on their website at mainesheriffs.org.

E. Corrections Report

Comm. Fournier asked if Sheriff's had weighed in on LD 463. Several attendees agreed to discuss the topic with their county sheriff to get their perspective. <u>Comm. Fowler moved and Admin. Scott Cole seconded supporting Penobscot County's solution to the jail overcrowding issue. The motion was passed unanimously.</u>

F. Annual Convention Report

Office Manager Lauren Haven reported the Convention Planning Committee will meet at the MCCA offices on Friday, March 10th. They are making progress and planning is on track for September.

G. NACo Report

The Legislative conference was February 25th through March 1st. Comm. Baldacci and Comm. Fowler attended educational sessions and meetings. Both attendees spoke about their experiences at the conference. Of note, other counties dealing with overcrowding were holding events to deal with warrant issues and minimize arrests. Many warrants are due to unpaid fines, missed court dates, or problems with paperwork. Participants pay a fee; the warrant is extinguished and the person leaves the event with a new court date or fee schedule.

Comm. Fowler encountered a weather-related flight cancellation which resulted in renting a car to drive back to Maine. <u>Comm. Cote moved and Comm. Blodgett seconded approving</u> <u>reimbursement for this cost. The motion was passed</u>.

VII. Other Business

President Baldacci presented Executive Director Rosemary Kulow with a retirement card signed by meeting attendees. He thanked her for her efforts over the past four years and her dedicated service to the MCCA. All present wished her a happy retirement and applauded his sentiments. Many congratulated her after the conclusion of the meeting as the group dispersed.

VIII. Adjournment

<u>Comm. Fournier made a motion to adjourn at approximately 11:40 a.m.; Admin. Pamela Hile</u> <u>seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.</u> The group adjourned to lunch.

NACo Steering Committees

How to Join a Committee

The president appoints all leaders to the committees and members to standing, ad hoc, advisory, task force and other committees.

The Audit Committee is a committee of the Board of Directors and is composed of Board members. The Board votes to determine who serves on the Audit Committee.

County officials and staff wishing to serve on a Policy Steering Committee must apply through their state associations of counties. After receiving a recommendation from the state association, the NACo president makes the appointment.

Members of Standing Committee and Ad Hoc Committees are appointed by the NACo president. A Presidential Appointment Form is available on NACo's website in April. Persons wishing to be considered for a leadership or committee appointment must complete the application and submit it by the posted deadline.

Appointments are announced by the president during the Annual Business Meeting held during the Annual Conference.

County officials and staff from counties with a population above 500,000 that are NACo members may participate in the Large Urban County Caucus.

County officials and staff from rural counties that are NACo members may participate in the Rural Action Caucus.

Do you have knowledge or expertise on key county issues? Do you want to become involved in the development of national policy issues affecting counties and your residents? Do you want to make your association stronger and more effective as a voice for counties?

Remember: NACo is you – you are an owner and shareholder in the National Association of Counties. Our association exists because of you and is made up of local leaders like you from across the United States. More than 1,300 county officials currently serve on NACo committees. That is why it is essential for you to become involved on a NACo committee. If you want to serve as a member of a NACo policy steering committee, contact your state association of counties.

There are 10 NACo policy steering committees that cover the full range of county policy issues.

Policy Steering Committee Nomination Process is Simple

Here are the important points to remember for participating on a policy steering committee:

• Fill out and submit a nomination form to serve on a NACo policy steering committee to your state association of counties.

• The policy steering committee nomination forms are on the NACo website (www.naco.org/nomination).

• Mark on the nomination form your first and second choice for which policy steering committee you would like to serve.

• Members of NACo affiliate organizations who want to serve on policy steering committees should follow the same process.

• Submit the form to your state association one month before the NACo Annual Conference, which usually occurs in July.

• NACo works to accommodate a nominee's first choice of policy steering committee assignments. Officials cannot transfer membership to another committee during their year of service, or serve on more than one policy steering committee during the year.

Policy Steering Committees Cover Issues Important to Counties

AGRICULTURE & RURAL AFFAIRS

Responsible for all matters pertaining to USDA agriculture, rural development programs, rural renewable energy development, research and extension, food safety, and conservation programs.

COMMUNITY, ECONOMIC & WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Responsible for all matters pertaining to housing, community and economic development, public works, and workforce development including the creation of affordable housing and housing options for different populations, residential, commercial, and industrial development, and building and housing codes.

ENVIRONMENT, ENERGY & LAND USE

Responsible for all matters pertaining to air, water, energy, and land use, including water resources/management, stormwater, pesticides, air quality standards, solid, hazardous, and nuclear waste handling, transport, and disposal, national energy policy, renewable/alternative energy, alternative fuel vehicles, energy facility siting, electricity utility restructuring, pipeline safety, oil spills, superfund/brownfields, eminent domain, land use, coastal management, oceans, parks and recreation.

FINANCE, PENSIONS & INTERGOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS

Responsible for all matters pertaining to the financial resources of counties, fiscal management, federal assistance, municipal borrowing, county revenues, pensions, the federal budget, federal tax reform, elections and Native American issues.

HEALTH

Responsible for all matters pertaining to public health and healthy communities, including disease and injury prevention, health disparities reduction, health financing, health insurance, Medicaid, Medicare, long-term care, behavioral health services, substance abuse prevention and treatment.

HUMAN SERVICES & EDUCATION

Responsible for all matters pertaining to children's issues, foster care, public assistance and income support, services to senior citizens and individuals with disabilities, immigration policy, social services, and elementary, secondary and post-secondary education.

JUSTICE & PUBLIC SAFETY

Responsible for all matters pertaining to criminal justice and public safety systems, including law enforcement, courts, corrections, homeland security, community crime prevention, juvenile justice and delinquency prevention, emergency management, fire prevention and control, and civil disturbances.

PUBLIC LANDS

Responsible for all matters pertaining to federally-owned public lands including federal land management programs, natural resource revenue sharing payments, payments in lieu of taxes, and property tax immunity concerns.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS & TECHNOLOGY

Responsible for all matters pertaining to telecommunications and technology policy, including the county role as a telecommunications regulator, service provider, and consumer.

TRANSPORTATION

Responsible for all matters pertaining to federal transportation legislation, funding and regulation and its impacts on county government. This includes highway and bridge development, finance and safety, public transit development and finance, transportation planning, airport development and service, passenger and freight railroads, ports and waterways, freight movement, and research and development of new modes of transportation.

Caucuses Address Key County Issues

Large Urban County Caucus

LUCC is a bipartisan coalition of elected county executives and board members from counties with more than 500,000 population. LUCC members work together to identify urban challenges, provide input in developing pragmatic national solutions, and implement grassroots programs that improve their communities.

Rural Action Caucus

RAC is the voice for America's rural counties before Congress and the Administration. County elected officials from rural areas are dedicated to solving many critical issues impacting rural life and development, including infrastructure development, broadband deployment, development of new rural clinics and hospitals, road and bridge construction and maintenance, business development opportunities, and many more county responsibilities.

Western Interstate Region

WIR is affiliated with NACo and is dedicated to the promotion of Western interests within NACo. WIR Board members are nominated by their state association of conties from only Western states.

Committees, Task Forces and Advisory Boards Cover Issues Important to Counties

Arts and Culture Commission

The Arts and Culture Commission demonstrates how the arts can be used by county officials to promote economic development and provide solutions to many of the challenges that they face, through workshop sessions, field trips and special publications.

Resilient Counties Advisory Board

The Resilient Counties initiative is governed by the Resilient Counties Advisory Board, which advises NACo on the development and implementation of the organization's resiliency and sustainability programs. The Advisory Board is made up of leaders from both county government and private organizations, and provides input to ensure that NACo's resiliency programming is timely, innovative and meets the greatest needs of the nation's 3,069 counties.

Healthy Counties Advisory Board

NACo's Healthy Counties is guided by the Healthy Counties Advisory Board, which is comprised of county officials and staff who are health leaders at NACo and corporate partners. The public/private Healthy Counties Advisory Board assists NACo in identifying the priorities and activities of the Healthy Counties Initiative and provides input and expertise on program implementation.

International Economic Development Task Force

This task force facilitates the exchange of information, ideas and resources, and guides NACo programming, concerning county-level engagement in international economic development activities.

Next Generation NACo Task Force

The Next Generation NACo Network provides a grassroots forum for young county officials to network, become engaged in NACo and develop a new generation of association leaders. The network identifies and serves the unique educational and professional development needs of young officials, and draws on the talent, ideas and expertise of young officials to influence NACo's strategic plan and programs and services for the future.

Veterans and Military Service Committee

This committee engages NACo and its members to develop and highlight county best practices and policies to promote innovative programs, services and benefits for our nation's military, veterans and their families.

Immigration Reform Task Force

NACo's Immigration Reform Task Force provides a forum for county officials from across the nation to discuss immigration and its impact on local governments. Although the Task Force does not vote on, or set, policy, it advises NACo's policy steering committees on immigration matters and engages on these matters with federal agencies and coalition partners.

Office Manager's Report April 7, 2017

In March, the MCCA staff has worked to keep county officials apprised of the status of countyrelated bills through the MCCA website, email and phone correspondence. The legislative committee schedule for public hearings and work sessions on bills the MCCA is monitoring has been posted daily. A new system for text and email alerts for legislative events has been developed. Our contracted Legislative Specialist, Charles Pray commenced work on March 20th and has re-acclimated to the Maine State House. He has submitted a legislative report found in section VI.C. of this agenda packet.

Retirement paperwork has been completed for retiring Executive Director, Rosemary Kulow. Her lobbyist status has been terminated and Charlie Pray has registered as an active lobbyist. Signatory authority for the MCCA bank accounts has been set up for me and the procedure for accounts payable has transitioned with no interruption. An account with "Betterteam" has been established and the executive director job opening has been posted on more than one hundred job sites. Currently, the Executive Committee has many interested candidates to discuss and evaluate.

In addition to general office business, the Convention Planning Committee met on March 10th. Somerset County was featured in the March newsletter. I attended the Maine Sheriff's Association Conference March 29th and 30th where I participated in several interesting trainings and had an opportunity to speak with Sheriff's and other representatives from Sheriff's offices around the state. I also facilitated the celebration of Maine County Government Day in the Hall of Flags at the Maine State House on April 3rd.

MAINE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ASSOCIATION March 2017 Financial Report

Attached please find the monthly financial reports for the month of March 2017. The Balance Sheet shows total assets and liabilities at \$212,333.51. The total includes the \$38,789 money market account for MainePERS employer contributions.

Upon approval of the Executive Committee, a one-time budget line item transfer was made in the amount of \$17,700 from account 5060-00 Executive Director Salary to 6032-00 Contractual Lobbying. Charles Pray, our Legislative Specialist will be paid from account 6032-00 as a private contractor.

Debits to the bank account in March totaled \$22,539.07, and receipts of \$311.16 were credited to the account. The general fund checking account balance as of April 2 was \$177,162.27, as some transactions had not yet cleared.

With about 26% of the year elapsed, approximately 56% of the \$258,321 budgeted revenue has been received. On the expenditure side, \$30,877 was expended in March; and \$67,130, or 26%, had been expended year-to-date.

Additional details of financial transactions appear in the *Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual* report. Finances are within budget for the year. Secretary-Treasurer Mike Cote would like to keep an eye on the NACo conference expenses as we plan for the NACo Annual Conference in July.

Legislative Liaison Report/April MCCA Meeting:

Charles Pray, Legislative Specialist

Stepping in mid-process has been a bit hectic but attuned to most things done legislatively, I find my absents of a quarter century somewhat of a Washington Irving's Van Winkle fable..., things have changed, but things are the same. Most of the individuals are new, a few the same, the issue(s)... similar in nature to forty years ago.

The first couple of weeks have been introducing, or re-introducing myself to the principals involved on County matters, Criminal Justice & Public Safety, State & Local Government, Appropriations & Financial Affairs, Legislative Leadership, and Legislative non-partisan staff (the people who provide the filtered facts and data to members). I have had a couple of brief conversations with the Speaker and the President of the respective Houses as well as a few other members of Leadership on both sides of the political aisle as well as a number of members with the near sole focus on the funding of jails issue. Let me run through them individually and my read of the conversations:

SENATE

- President Thibodeau (Waldo) is aware of the issue, implied understanding of the Counties' concerns and an interest to support resolving the funding question but expressed no commitment to take a lead on it.
- Senator Mason, Majority Leader (Androscoggin), I have not had the opportunity to meet with.
- Senator Cushing, Asst. Majority Leader (Penobscot) stated he was aware of the issue, needs to see where Appropriation is.
- Senator Jackson, Minority Leader, (Aroostook) knows Aroostook is very concerned; somewhat supportive, focused on other issues.
- Senator Libby, Asst. Minority Leader (Androscoggin), very informed, visited the jail with the Sheriff, knowledgeable different Counties have different interests. Sheriff Samson seems to have a good rapport with him.
- Chairwoman Senator Rosen, (Waldo/Penobscot) was guarded in our conversation.
- Senator Cryway, (Kennebec) I have not had the opportunity to converse with but expressed serious concerns his constituents can nor stand an increase in property taxes.
- Senator Diamond, (Cumberland) knowledgeable, knows the issues. he's guarded, noncommittal.
- Senator Breen, (Cumberland) non-committal.
- Senator Davis, (Piscataquis) knowledgeable on the issue, non-committal.

HOUSE

- Speaker Gideon, (Cumberland) aware of the issues, understanding of the Counties' concerns and an interest to support resolving the funding question. Said she would meet with her County officials if they requested an opportunity to give her more insight.
- Rep. Herbig, (Waldo) very willing to meet with County officials. She went out of her way to come down on County Day to meet her officials there.

- The remaining Leadership, Minority Leader Fredette, Asst. Espling and Asst. Majority Leader Golden have been either tied-up in meetings or not in when I have stopped by.
- Rep. Gerrish (Androscoggin) and I have had several conversations, texts and emails. She and Rep. Grohman (Cumberland) will host an initial meeting April 11th to see who needs to be participating – while keeping the group small. They both want it to happen but do not seem sure of a process at this point. I suggested Staff (Jane Orbeton) could help her, having done these break-out groups before for years, even back in my tenure.
- Rep. Gattine, (Cumberland) of course guarded, respects CJSP Chairwoman Warren greatly. Would like to see the working group's recommendations.
- Rep. John Martin, (Aroostook) "... have to solve the problem, jails need help."
- Rep. Danny Martin, (Aroostook) knows the issue well.
- I also had a conversation with Geoff Herman, MMA's Director of State & Federal Relations* following up on our conversation Monday on the Senator Diamond bill for the State to take over the County Jail system, a MMA proposal. We talked about maybe a small meeting of maybe the MCCA's officiers with Geoff, Stephen Grove, their Executive Dir. and MMA's President Laurie Smith, Town Manager of Kennebunkport and VP Linda Cohen, Councilor, South Portland.

*A disclosure, I am also a Town Councilor from Millinocket, I am a member of the MMA's Legislative Policy Review Committee (somewhat absent member – they have had all but one meeting on a Council meeting day).

If we (MCCA) are going to propose a local (County) tax, we need to be talking with them as to the reasons we are suggesting alternative funding mechanism. As you all well know municipalities have long sought that authority as well. They need to not come after us on this so I would think a conversation on the reality of what will come out of this session - we should be on the same side - not wanting the resident property taxpayer bearing a greater burden because a few seek to shift the burden in a NIMB (Not In My Budget) approach to other governances. MMA should and need to advocate the State funding of the incarceration of individuals who have performed and/or charged with criminal acts against other individuals and/or properties of Maine citizens and non-citizens of the State of Maine as described and defined by Maine Revised Statues enacted by the duly elected Maine State Legislature.
