MCCA Board of Directors' Meeting Minutes 10:00 a.m., May 13, 2015

I. Call to Order, Introductions, Attendance and Pledge of Allegiance

President William Blodgett called the meeting to order at 10:30 a.m. The attendees recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. Approval of/Additions to the Agenda

<u>Comm. Baldacci moved and Comm. Joy seconded approving the agenda as presented.</u>
The motion was approved unanimously.

III. Approval of Meeting Minutes

<u>Comm. Fournier moved and Comm. Blodgett seconded approving the minutes as written.</u>
<u>The motion was approved unanimously.</u>

IV. Old Business

A. Select County Host of 2016 Annual MCCA Convention

Comm. Baldacci offered to host the 2016 convention in Penobscot County. By that time, there will be a Marriot hotel open next to the Cross Center sufficient to meet our needs. The preferred week days are Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Comm. Fowler *moved* and Comm. Fournier seconded the *motion* to accept Penobscot's offer. The *motion* passed with a unanimous vote.

B. MCCA Counties Questionnaire

Executive Director Rosemary Kulow explained that a County Survey has been developed from the adopted strategic plan. Answers to the survey questions will help MCCA continue to move forward. The group discussed who should fill out the survey. It was agreed that in order to keep a balanced perspective, each county should submit one survey completed by a commissioner or county representative of their choosing.

C. Corrections Legislation Discussion

Assistant Manager Bill Whitten passed out a handout showing the impact on jail budgets if the boarding rate amount is determined to be \$50 per day, \$75 per day, or \$100 per day. The group discussed the Ricky Long Amendment and proposed changes to that amendment which have not been made public at this point. It is thought that there was a passing vote with the absentee ballots cast. After more discussion on the topic, <u>Comm. Coward made a motion to instruct a lobbyist to work to retain some form of the BOC and having appropriate representation, control and appropriate funding \$17 to \$18 million going forward. Comm. Jabar seconded the motion. The motion failed six to ten. Comm. Fournier then made a motion to support the Sheriff's position, but with funding of \$17-\$18 million. Administrator Pam Hile seconded the motion. The motion failed with a vote of seven in favor, eight against and one abstention. Comm. Baldacci made a motion to support Representative Long's amendment, as amended by the committee's Democrats with the following revisions:</u>

- The cap be removed right away for FY 15/16
- The cap be lifted for all future years
- And limited to the LD1 growth rate or 3%, whichever is less
- Any reference to the Flannagan report be struck
- State funding \$17.2 million, which is conservative and justifiable

<u>Treasurer David Parkman seconded the **motion**, and it **passed** with a vote of twelve to three (12-3).</u>

V. New Business

A. Discussion of MCCA Newsletter

Executive Director Rosemary Kulow requested stronger participation by the counties in contributing to the content of the MCCA newsletter. She suggested each county designate a contact who would work with Lauren to develop materials for articles on a regular basis.

B. Consideration of Online Payment Service

Ms. Kulow explained MCCA staff had been researching online payment service options and were ready to move forward with the project using the company "Square". The primary benefit would be to give convention attendees the option to register and pay online. <u>Administrator Scott Cole made a motion to approve entering into an agreement with Square, seconded by Comm. Fowler. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.</u>

Excerpt from the NACo Bylaws:

Article VI, Section 1. Membership

The board of directors is comprised of elected officials of active member counties or designated officials as follows:

1. One (1) elected official from each state which has an active member county. That official must be

from a county whose membership dues are fully paid at the time of the close of credentials registration at the annual conference.

2. Twelve (12) elected officials from active member counties, one (1) from each of the 12 states having

the highest number of votes as certified by the Credentials Committee based upon NACo membership as of 60 days before the first day of the annual conference, provided that such state has either 50 percent of its counties as active member counties or has active member counties representing 50 percent of the state's population. Where a state, otherwise qualified, fails to meet either 50 percent standard, it shall not be eligible for an additional director under this paragraph; the state having the next highest number of votes will be elevated to the list, provided that such state meets either 50 percent standard.

3. One elected county official from each state having 100 percent of its counties as active members.

IMPORTANT: If your state is eligible for more than one seat on the Board, please designate which category each person is representing; (1 – state seat, 2 – Top 12 seat, 3 – 100% membership seat)

The Nominating Committee Report is being prepared for presentation at the Annual Business meeting. This report will list every person nominated by a state association to serve on the Board. We want to be sure that every state association in represented on the NACo Board of Directors in accordance with the NACo Bylaws and in order to accomplish this we must receive your nomination so that it is included in the report and so the NACo Membership will be able to vote on it.

If you cannot or do not submit a nomination at the Annual Conference, your first opportunity to nominate a board representative will be at the NACo Fall Board of Directors' meeting in December.

- Candidates are being asked to follow the candidate guidelines
- Candidates are not permitted to campaign at steering committee meetings
- There will be a candidates' forum during the conference
- It is possible for a candidate from the floor at the business meeting

State Caucus Meetings at Annual Conference

- Because multiple candidates are expected to run, you should allow for enough time for each to give brief remarks during your caucus meetings

Bylaws Amendment on Weighted Voting

• A bylaws committee was not appointed before the deadline passed for informing the membership about the proposed amendment on weighted voting. HOWEVER, we fully expect an amendment that was passed by the Board to be brought to the floor of the annual business meeting through the petition process – at least 10 active member counties from at least five different states. The amendment would change the current weighed voting of one vote for every \$500 in dues to a new formula of one vote for every \$1200 in dues, as recommended by the NACo Election Review Task Force. This change would essentially restore the voting formula to the early 1990s.

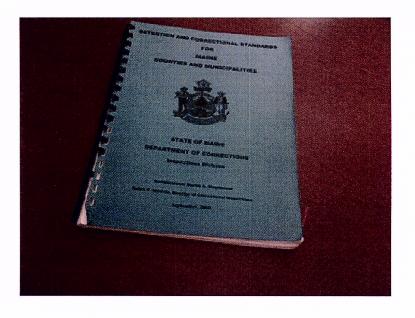
MRSA 34-A §1208. STANDARDS FOR COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL DETENTION FACILITIES
