Waldo County is proud to announce Dispatch Supervisor **Linda Wry-Remillard** has become a certified Emergency Numbers Professional.

This is quite an accomplishment as it required over 200 hours of studying, followed by a three hour, 150 question exam. By successfully completing this certification, Linda demonstrated a mastery of the comprehensive knowledge base required for emergency number program management, and confirmed her commitment to the 9-1-1 profession by showing her ability to be a leader in public safety.

Linda is now one of only six certified in the entire State of Maine, the first and only in Waldo County, and one of only two ENPs that work within the Dispatch field.

The NENA Executive Board first formed a Certification Committee in 1992 to develop the certification program for individuals involved in emergency number program management. The goal of the certification program is to promote a standard of competence for Emergency Number Professionals that will be recognized and accepted by the 9-1-1 profession, government agencies, and the general public; to ensure an awareness of current issues and developments in the 9-1-1 profession; and to encourage professional growth.
