






Federal Policy Advocacy

Federal Policy Advocacy





2018 Legislative Priorities:

- Promote county infrastructure priorities
- Support the Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) and Secure Rural Schools (SRS) programs
- Support policies to promote mental health, substance abuse treatment and justice reform
- Protect the federal-state-local partnership for Medicaid
- Work towards a more effective definition of Waters of the U.S. (WOTUS)
- Support county authority to collect existing sales tax
- Support programs that assist counties to prevent and reduce poverty
- Support a comprehensive long-term farm bill reauthorization

The Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center (MS-ISAC®) is a key resource for cyber threat prevention, protection, response and recovery for county governments. **Participation is free.**



IBTS provides disaster planning services, initial disaster response, active disaster recovery (including debris removal management), disaster recovery administration and more at no initial cost to NACo members.



Offers county employees a voluntary, tax-deferred Compensation savings opportunity to supplement employer-sponsored retirement plants. It also offers a 401(a) match and stand-alone contribution plans.







Live Healthy

The NACo Live Healthy program can be used anytime a prescription is not covered by insurance – even for pets! The program is "Pharmacy-friendly" (it is <u>not</u> insurance)

Prescriptions can be filled at more than 68,000 participating pharmacies nationwide = over 9 out of 10 pharmacies.

All major chain pharmacies participate, including: Rite-Aid, Walgreens, CVS, Wal-Mart, Target, grocery store chains, most independents


